<p>CRISIS INTERVENTION TRAINING: (40 hrs.) (TCOLE 1850) This Crisis Intervention Training provides the key concepts, safety techniques, and communication skills. This course will include a combination of lecture, scenario role-play and physical modeling. Participants are expected to be actively involved both verbally and physically. Peace Officers licensed on or after 04/01/18 must take this course within 2 years of licensing if not taken during BPOC (Occupations Code 1701.253(j), or before the date the officer applies for an Intermediate Proficiency Certificate. CIT Update (3843) will fulfill continuing education requirement for officers licensed prior to 4/1/18. Those holding an Intermediate or higher are exempt from this provision. <p>D.W.I. DETECTION AND STANARDIZED FIELD SOBRIETY TESTING (SFST) PRACTITIONER UPDATE: (8 hrs.) (TCOLE 2178) This refresher course is designed to improve the administration and overall consistency of the Standardized Field Sobriety Test (SFST) Battery. The course will cover recognizing and interpreting DWI Evidence, administering, and interpreting the SFST, describing DWI Evidence clearly and convincingly, recent case law and research studies, and provides an overview of drug impairment driving. <i>A minimum of 5 students or the course is subjected to be canceled.</i> Prerequisite- For Peace Officers. <p>HONOR GUARD PRACTICE: (8 hrs.) (TCOLE 6037) This academy will equip emergency services personnel with the fundamental elements of honor guard duties. 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<p>OFFICER STRESS IN CORRECTIONS: (4 hrs.) (TCOLE 2190) Whether it's acknowledged to be factual or not, stress is a silent killer among correctional officers and detention officers. This viewpoint is often challenged by correctional officers who resist the suggestion it can happen to them as they are stronger than the average person working inside a large jail or prison thus immune to such an invasion of the body, spirit or mind. ****Physical Fitness Requirement****

Some courses offered by the El Paso County Sheriff's Office Region VIII Training Academy will require a degree of physical fitness.

Minimum Level- This level will consist of walking, stepping, and very light cardiovascular exercise.

Medium Level- This level will consist of jogging; minimal levels of calisthenics (i.e. push-ups, sit-ups, side straddle hop); and/or beginning levels of hands on contact (i.e. PPCT and O.C.).

Maximum Level- This level will consist of running; sprinting; advanced calisthenics; and/or advanced levels of hands on contact (i.e. mobile field force, physical fitness exams).

Medium and maximum- These levels will require a blood pressure screening and students who do not pass will not be allowed to participate without a doctor's release on file.
